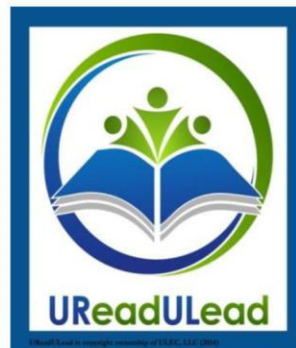

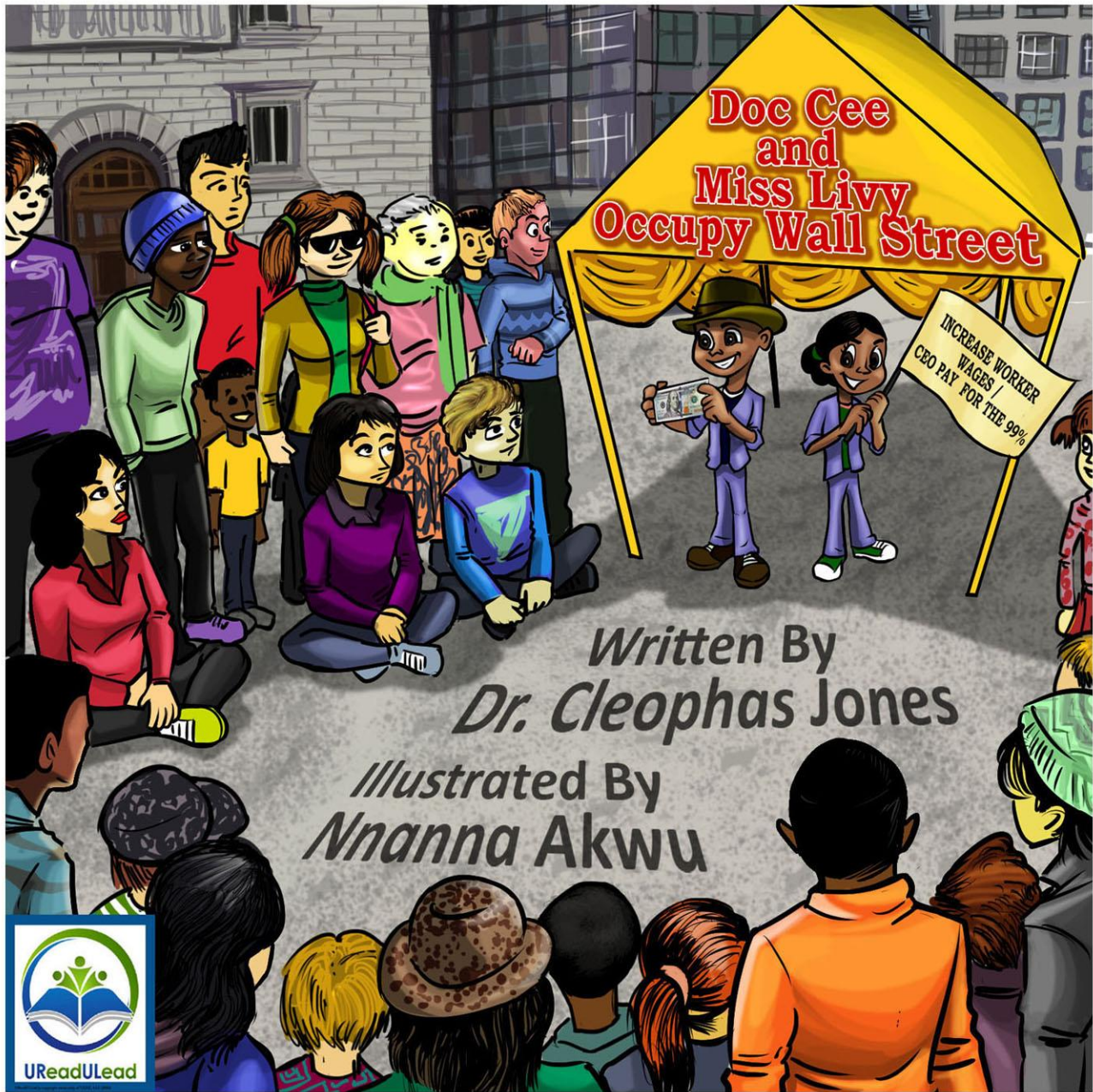
Who Are Doc Cee and Miss Livy?
